

Overview / Using Your AED



In case of emergency

- 1. Press Green On/Off button to turn the defibrillator on.
- 2. Follow the prompts.
- 3. If a shock is required you will be prompted to press the Red Shock button
- 4. Continue to follow the prompts.

LED / LCD Screen Indicators

LCD Screen displays self test results:

Low Battery

If the battery is low this icon will appear:

ORDER NEW BATTERY

System Malfunction

If there is a fault this icon will appear:

CONTACT HEART SAVER

System Normal

If all is normal this icon will appear: OK

NO ACTION REQUIRED

Green Power LED

- LED is bright


 Indicates the
 charge left in the

- LED flashes slowly

 Indicates the
 charge left in the
 battery is partially
 depleted
- LED flashes fast

 Indicates the
 charge left in the

 battery is low



Red LED

flashes when defibrillator is fully charged.

Self Testing Indicator

On commencement of the daily/monthly self-test, this LED indicator will turn on; and automatically turn off on completion. Results will be displayed in the LCD.

Indicator Light Prompts

- Check Pad LED Flashes
 - Defibrillator pads are not properly attached to the patient or are not properly connected to the AED7000
- Caution LED Flashes
 - DO NOT TOUCH OR MOVE THE PATIENT
- Analyzing LED Flashes

 ECG leads are
 properly connected

 and the system is
 assessing the patient's
 heart rhythm

Replacing the Battery

Battery replacement is recommended at 5 years. You can order a new battery for your AED7000 on our website by <u>clicking here</u> (or go to: https://www.heartsaver.co.nz/products/heart-saver-aed7000-replacement-battery). Please follow the below instructions to replace the battery. You can also watch a short video <u>here</u>.



To replace the battery follow the steps below:

- Write the date of installation on the "New Battery Installed" sticker.
- 2. Open the battery compartment (located near the bottom of the backside of the AED7000) by removing the thumbscrews. Slip the plate up before pulling plate off.



- 3. Unplug the existing battery by gently pulling out the white 3-pin battery connector.
- 4. Turn the unit over and press the ON/OFF button. Wait until LED screen goes blank (you will still be able to see the battery/spanner icons). Leave unit like this for 60 seconds.



- Connect the new battery by pushing the white 3-pin battery connector onto the contact pins.
- 6. Place the battery into the battery compartment.
- 7. Replace the battery cover by sliding the cover back so that the screw holes are aligned.
- 8. Replace the thumbscrews.

When you have installed the new battery, the AED unit will take a minute or two to boot back up. When it has completed its self-test, please check the LED screen on the front of the unit - you should be able to see "OK" and two black-shaded boxes (covering the spanner and battery icons).

PLEASE NOTE: Use only M&B Part No. CR123A-4x2 non-rechargeable lithium batteries. Use of any other battery can damage the AED7000.
